As these metal plates are new to the ARB, please plan on submitting a sample to ensure the color is the same as clay or cement tiles.

As I write this report, all our oak trees are in the process of being trimmed by Polk tree Service. Also, the dangling branches called widow makers are being removed at the same time. It will take them about two weeks.

The oaks have weathered three hurricanes, Ian, Helene and Milton and are looking bedraggled and blown around. But they seem to be recovering okay.

Hurricane season is over until next year now thank goodness. Sarasota County has yet to

remove the road debris, but we have been advised that this will occur very soon. We are anxiously waiting for this to happen.

#### Reminder:

Please be sure to put ONLY yard waste for pickup. This means NO roof tiles, no trash in the debris. Use paper bags for leaves and branches.

Mowing is done bi-weekly now from November to March 31st.

As we enter this cooler, darker season, it's a great time to do the garden chores you have been putting off.

If you are planning to refresh your gardens with new plantings or a whole redo, be sure to notify the grounds committee for an approval BEFORE you start.

Reminder: Absolutely No trees, palms can be removed without first getting grounds committee approval.

We are still concentrating on storm damage and will be removing dead and/or dying palm trees when storm cleanup is done. Please be patient, we won't forget you.

On November 18 the Chestnut Creek Master Association (CCMA) sent an email to Patios residents whose property abuts Lake 11 reminding them of the upcoming construction scheduled to begin in mid-February. It requested that homeowners contact Key-Caldwell thru their website to request an appointment with the Lakes Committee to review and sign a General Agreement regarding the construction. Also, the shoreline directly behind the Patios clubhouse and pool is under consideration for repair as the bank has significantly eroded and threatens to undermine the pool. These General Agreements must be completed before year-end 2024 as well as any actions required of homeowners on their property.
